All 12 English Tenses, period! (.)

1. Present Simple

- How is it formed? Subject + base verb (for he, she, it, add -s or -es).
- Examples:
 - I work every day.
 - $\circ~$ She reads books in the evening.
 - They play football on weekends.

2. Present Continuous

- How is it formed?
 Subject + am/are/is + verb + -ing.
- Examples:
 - I am studying for my exams.
 - He is playing tennis right now.
 - \circ They are watching a movie at the moment.

- **3. Present Perfect**
 - How is it formed?
 Subject + has/have + past participle.
 - Examples:
 - I have finished my homework.
 - She has visited Paris three times.
 - We have learned a lot this semester.

4. Present Perfect Continuous

- How is it formed?
 Subject + has/have + been + verb + -ing.
- Examples:
 - \circ I have been working here for two years.
 - She has been reading for an hour.
 - They have been traveling all over Europe.

5. Past Simple

- How is it formed?
 Subject + past form of the verb.
- Examples:
 - I watched a movie last night.
 - He finished his project yesterday.
 - \circ They went to the beach last weekend.

6. Past Continuous

- How is it formed?
 Subject + was/were + verb + -ing.
- Examples:
 - \circ I was reading when the phone rang.
 - She was working on her computer at 7 PM.
 - They were watching TV when I arrived.
- 7. Past Perfect
 - How is it formed?
 Subject + had + past participle.
 - Examples:
 - I had already eaten when she called.
 - He had finished the report before the meeting.
 - They had left by the time we arrived.
- 8. Past Perfect Continuous
 - How is it formed?
 Subject + had + been + verb + -ing.
 - Examples:
 - \circ I had been waiting for an hour when he finally arrived.
 - \circ She had been studying all afternoon.
 - They had been traveling before they found a place to stay.

9. Future Simple

- How is it formed?
 Subject + will + base verb.
- Examples:
 - I will go to the store tomorrow.
 - He will call you later.
 - They will visit us next summer.

10. Future Continuous

- How is it formed?
 Subject + will be + verb + -ing.
- Examples:
 - I will be traveling next week.
 - She will be working at 10 AM tomorrow.
 - They will be studying all afternoon.

11. Future Perfect

- How is it formed?
 Subject + will have + past participle.
- Examples:
 - $\circ~$ I will have finished the book by tomorrow.
 - He will have completed the project by next month.
 - $\circ~$ They will have arrived by the time the concert starts.

12. Future Perfect Continuous

- How is it formed?
 Subject + will have been + verb + -ing.
- Examples:
 - I will have been working here for five years by next month.
 - She will have been studying for three hours by noon.
 - They will have been traveling for a month by the time they return.

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
