Most Used English Phrasal Verbs

1. Get up

- **Meaning:** To rise from bed.
- **Example:** "I usually get up at 7 AM."

2. Turn on

- **Meaning:** To start something working.
- **Example:** "Can you turn on the TV?"

3. Take off

- **Meaning:** To remove clothing or to depart (for planes).
- **Example:** "He took off his jacket." / "The plane takes off at 6 PM."

4. Put on

- **Meaning:** To dress oneself.
- **Example:** "She put on her shoes."

5. Look for

- **Meaning:** To search.
- **Example:** "I'm looking for my keys."

6. Give up

- **Meaning:** To stop trying.
- **Example:** "Don't give up!"

7. Look after

- **Meaning:** To take care of.
- **Example:** "Can you look after my dog?"

8. Break down

- **Meaning:** To stop working (for machines).
- **Example:** "My car broke down on the way home."

9. Run out of

- **Meaning:** To have none left.
- **Example:** "We ran out of milk."

10. Set up

- **Meaning:** To arrange or establish.
- **Example:** "He set up the meeting."

11. Turn off

- **Meaning:** To stop something working.
- **Example:** "Please turn off the lights."

12. Take up

- **Meaning:** To start a new hobby or activity.
- **Example:** "She took up painting."

13. Go on

- **Meaning:** To continue.
- **Example:** "Please go on with your story."

14. Get over

- **Meaning:** To recover from.
- **Example:** "It took me a while to get over the flu."

15. Find out

- **Meaning:** To discover.
- **Example:** "I found out the truth yesterday."

16. Pick up

- **Meaning:** To collect.
- **Example:** "Can you pick me up at the station?"

17. Put off

- **Meaning:** To postpone.
- **Example:** "They put off the meeting until next week."

18. Break up

- **Meaning:** To end a relationship.
- **Example:** "They decided to break up."

19. Bring up

- **Meaning:** To raise a topic.
- **Example:** "She brought up an interesting point."

20. Fall apart

- **Meaning:** To break into pieces.
- **Example:** "The old book fell apart in my hands."

21. Run into

- **Meaning:** To meet by chance.
- **Example:** "I ran into an old friend yesterday."

22. Take out

- **Meaning:** To remove.
- **Example:** "Please take out the trash."

23. Put up with

- **Meaning:** To tolerate.
- **Example:** "I can't put up with this noise anymore."

24. Run away

- **Meaning:** To escape.
- **Example:** "The cat ran away from home."

25. Look forward to

- **Meaning:** To anticipate with pleasure.
- **Example:** "I'm looking forward to the weekend."

26. Put down

- **Meaning:** To criticize.
- **Example:** "Don't put him down; he's doing his best."

27. Check out

- **Meaning:** To examine or leave a hotel.
- **Example:** "You should check out this book." / "We need to check out by noon."

28. Move on

- **Meaning:** To continue.
- **Example:** "Let's move on to the next topic."

29. Hold on

- **Meaning:** To wait.
- **Example:** "Please hold on for a moment."

30. Pass out

- **Meaning:** To faint.
- **Example:** "He passed out from the heat."

31. Work out

- **Meaning:** To exercise or solve.
- **Example:** "I work out every morning." / "We need to work out this problem."

32. Call off

- **Meaning:** To cancel.
- **Example:** "The event was called off due to rain."

33. Drop off

- **Meaning:** To leave someone or something at a place.
- **Example:** "I'll drop you off at school."

34. Catch up

- **Meaning:** To reach the same point or level.

- **Example:** "I need to catch up on my reading."

35. Get along

- **Meaning:** To have a good relationship.
- **Example:** "Do you get along with your colleagues?"

36. Come up with

- **Meaning:** To think of (an idea).
- **Example:** "She came up with a brilliant plan."

37. Cut down on

- **Meaning:** To reduce.
- **Example:** "I need to cut down on sugar."

38. Hang out

- **Meaning:** To spend time socially.
- **Example:** "Let's hang out this weekend."

39. Put back

- **Meaning:** To return something to its place.
- **Example:** "Please put the book back on the shelf."

40. Look out

- **Meaning:** To be careful.
- **Example:** "Look out! There's a car coming."

41. Keep up with

- **Meaning:** To stay at the same level as.
- **Example:** "I try to keep up with current events."

42. Give in

- **Meaning:** To surrender or yield.
- **Example:** "She finally gave in to his demands."

43. Show up

- **Meaning:** To appear or arrive.
- **Example:** "He didn't show up for the meeting."

44. Take after

- **Meaning:** To resemble (a family member).
- **Example:** "She takes after her mother."

45. Turn down

- **Meaning:** To reject or lower the volume.
- **Example:** "He turned down the offer." / "Please turn down the music."

46. Back up

- **Meaning:** To support or make a copy.
- **Example:** "I need you to back me up on this." / "Always back up your files."

47. Get away

- **Meaning:** To escape or go on a vacation.
- **Example:** "The thief got away." / "We plan to get away this weekend."

48. Call up

- **Meaning:** To call someone on the phone.
- **Example:** "I'll call you up later."

49. Come across

- **Meaning:** To find by chance.
- **Example:** "I came across an old photo album."

50. Make up

- **Meaning:** To invent or reconcile.
- **Example:** "She made up a funny story." / "They made up after the argument."
